**Host First Nation Charitable Casino Policies Handbook (HFNCCPH)**

**Bursaries and Scholarships  
Section 7.5.6**

**Education  
Section 7.12.2**

The policy requires that eligible individuals receiving educational funding from the charity must attend a school/institution that is recognized by the Government of Alberta (GoA); individuals attending schools/institutions not recognized by the GoA may be otherwise approved by the Alberta Gaming and Liquor Commission (AGLC).

**Interpretation**

For the purposes of the policies listed here, “*otherwise approved by the AGLC*” means that the AGLC will examine on a case-by-case basis allowing charitable proceeds to be used for bursaries or scholarships to attend a school or for specific educational programs within a school that is not on the list of Alberta schools/institutions recognized by the GoA.

**Examples**

**Educational programs that may be eligible for approval by the AGLC**

- Educational programs offered through a school or institution included on the Government of Canada’s list of Alberta post secondary institutions. This list includes privately funded schools as well as additional universities and colleges.
- Educational programs that are offered only through schools or institutions outside of the geographical area.
- First acceptance of school or institution.
- Acceptance to an Ivy League university or college i.e. Harvard.
- Student lives outside of the province and is a community member (need definition of community member).
- Assessment by a professional (educator, school counselor, principal) to determine requirements for the individual, i.e. special needs, hockey program, religious.

**NOTE:** Because each approval will be granted on its own merits, the above examples do not create an automatic entitlement.
